
Worry Woos

From loneliness to confusion to frustration each WorryWoo story tackles complicated feelings and puts a positive spin on topics that don't have easy answers.

Since inception, The WorryWoos are now used in homes, schools and counseling centers in all 50 states as well as internationally in Australia, Canada, England, Ireland, Singapore, and Hong Kong.

Our team includes therapists, psychologists and teachers who came together to help create a full WorryWoo Emotional Intelligence curriculum that helps children discuss their feelings not only in the general classroom but also in the creative arts classes. Through years of research, we have learned the WorryWoo program strengthens empathy, resilience and the understanding of both complicated and basic emotions.

PWHL TAKEOVER


PWHL Takeover Tour: An Empowering Experience for 36 Young Ladies
